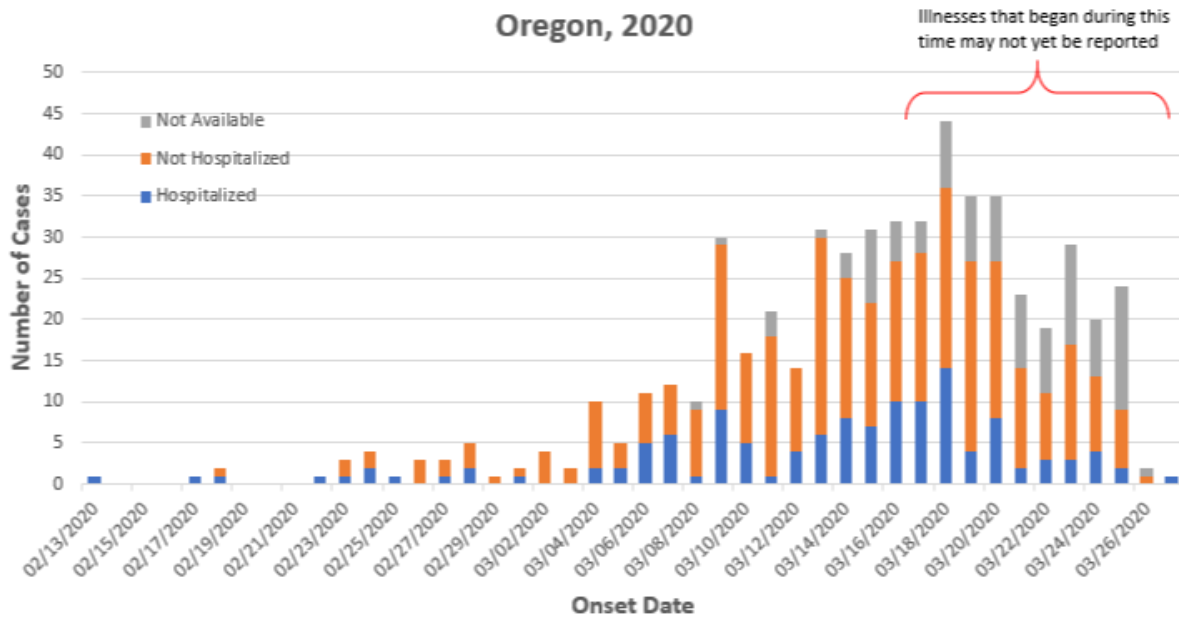

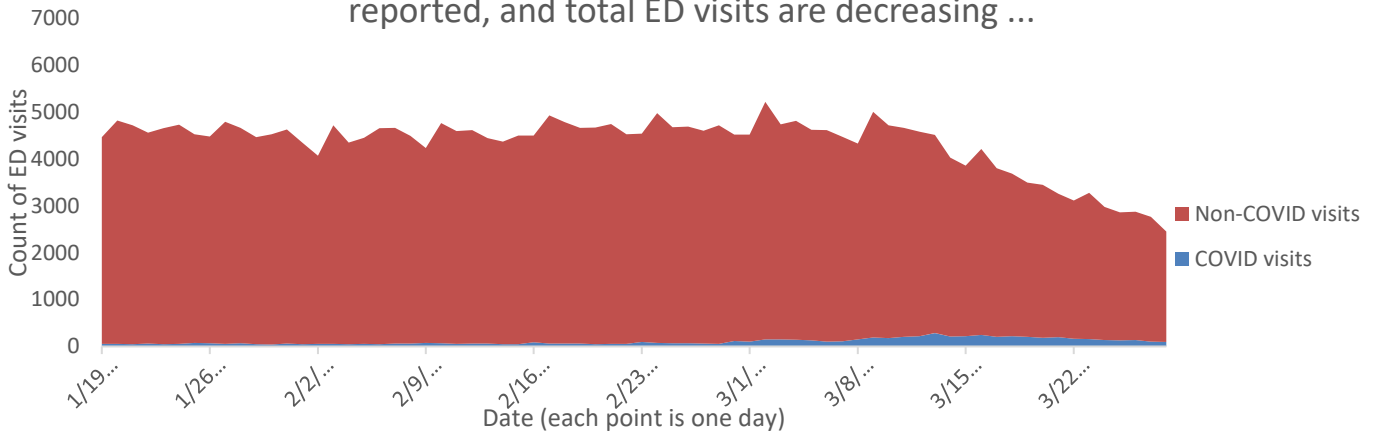

  - o 2,082 total persons have been tested for COVID-19 at OSPHL since 2/28

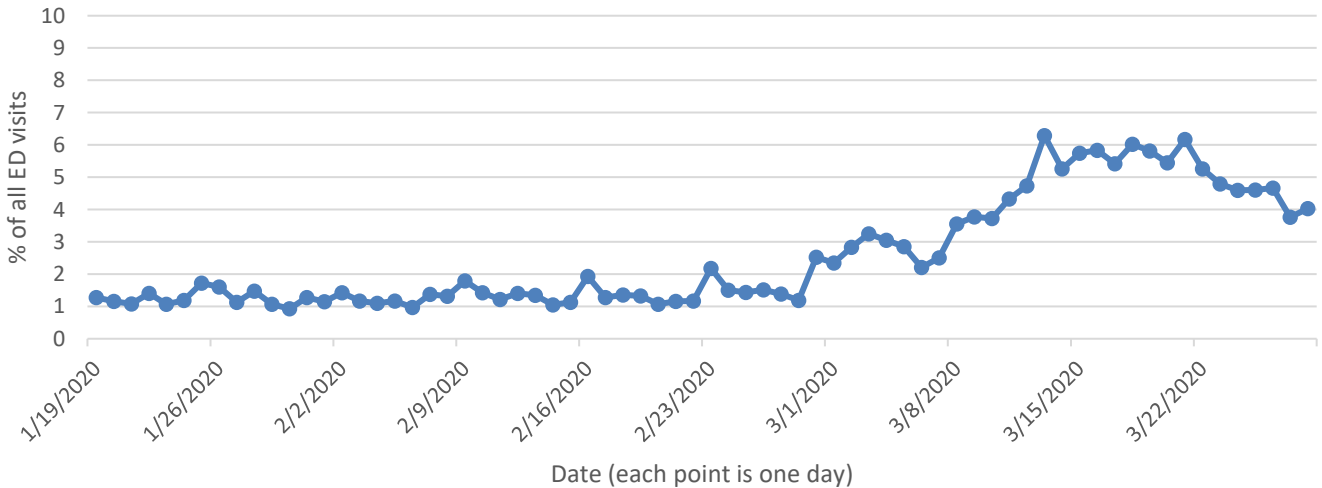
### COVID-19 Cases by Symptom Onset Date and Hospitalization Status, Oregon, 2020
