- 690 cases in Oregon
 - 18 deaths reported in Oregon
 - 13,826 people tested for COVID-19 in Oregon
- Oregon State Public Health Laboratory (OSPHL) Testing:**
- 2,225 total persons have been tested for COVID-19 at OSPHL
 - 25 specimens were received 3/30; 54 OSPHL test results were released on 3/30
 - 52 specimens pending as of 8:00 PM 3/30

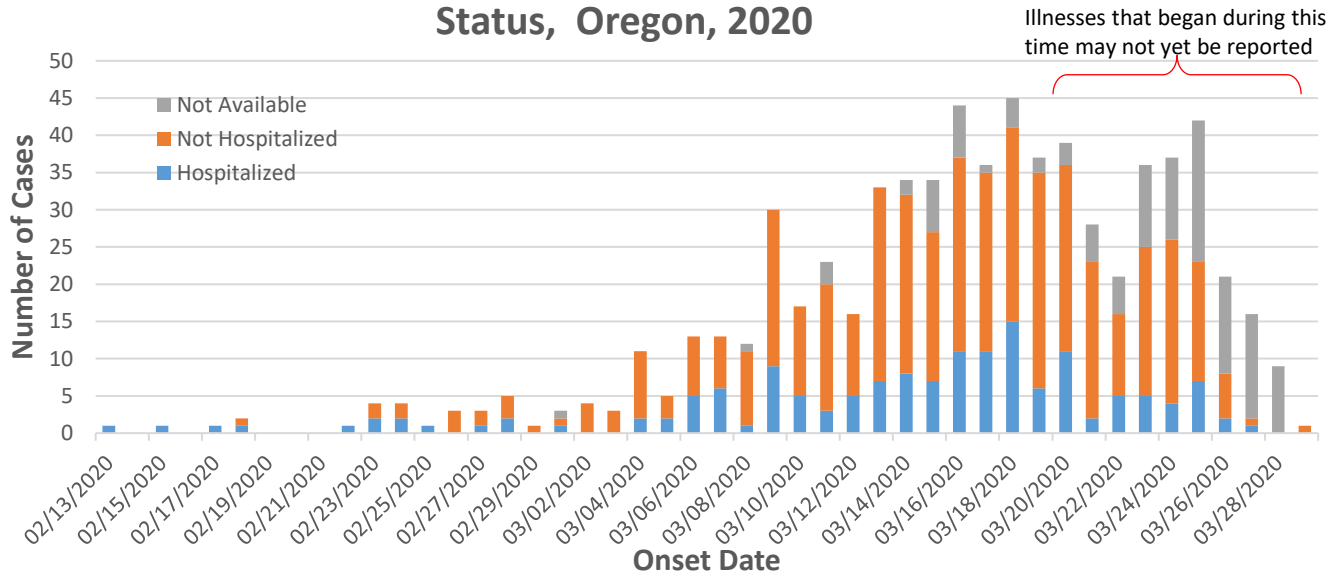
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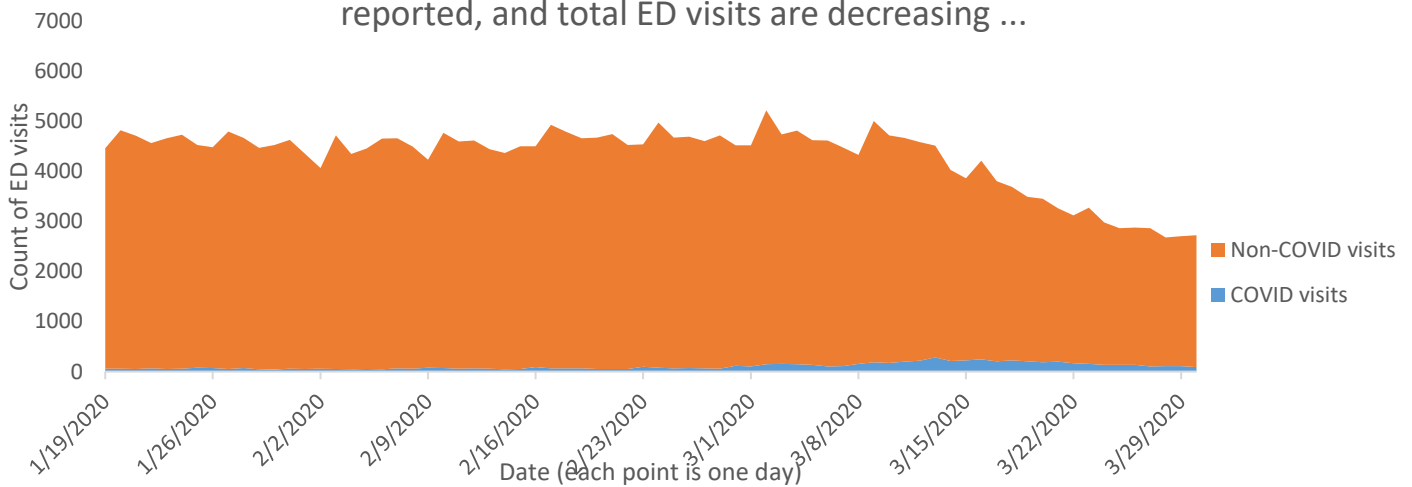


COVID-19 Cases by Symptom Onset Date and Hospitalization

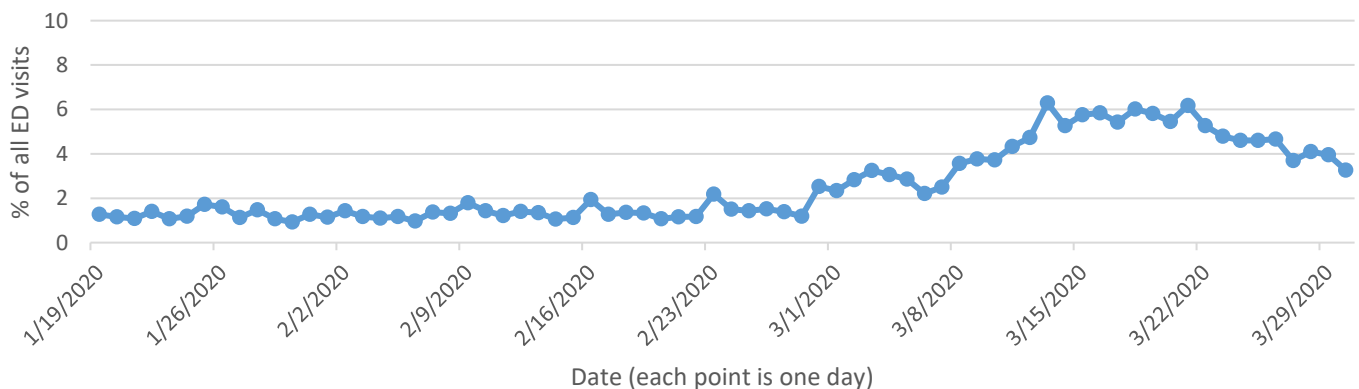

Working with Oregon DAS on solutions. - No water source or distribution concerns currently.

The volunteer issue, limited extra ordinary life saving resources and limited trauma medical facilities had an effect on requesting extreme hiking and climbing areas be restricted on federal lands.

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 ESF 15 Volunteers and Donations	Anticipated Instability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - There is a shortage of volunteer workforce causing decrease in service delivery - Numerous organizations are offering assistance and resources to the response efforts
 ESF 16 Law Enforcement	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Monitoring decreasing workforce due to COVID-19. - Oregon Corrections Enterprise has created a template for making N95 (or just surgical) masks, medical gowns and hand sanitizer. They are being reviewed by Oregon Health Authority to make sure they meet standards before mass production. <p>Fatality Management</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Deaths due to COVID-19 do not exceed statewide mortuary capacity
 ESF 17 Agriculture and Animal Protection	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Developing guidance for food retailers and food processors related to the Governor's Executive Order and how to maintain proper social distancing in grocery stores. ODA has also been working with farmer's markets and livestock auctions to provide guidance on implementation of the Governor's executive orders
 ESF 18 Business and Industry	Stable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Enabling local production of hand sanitizer to increase available supply.
