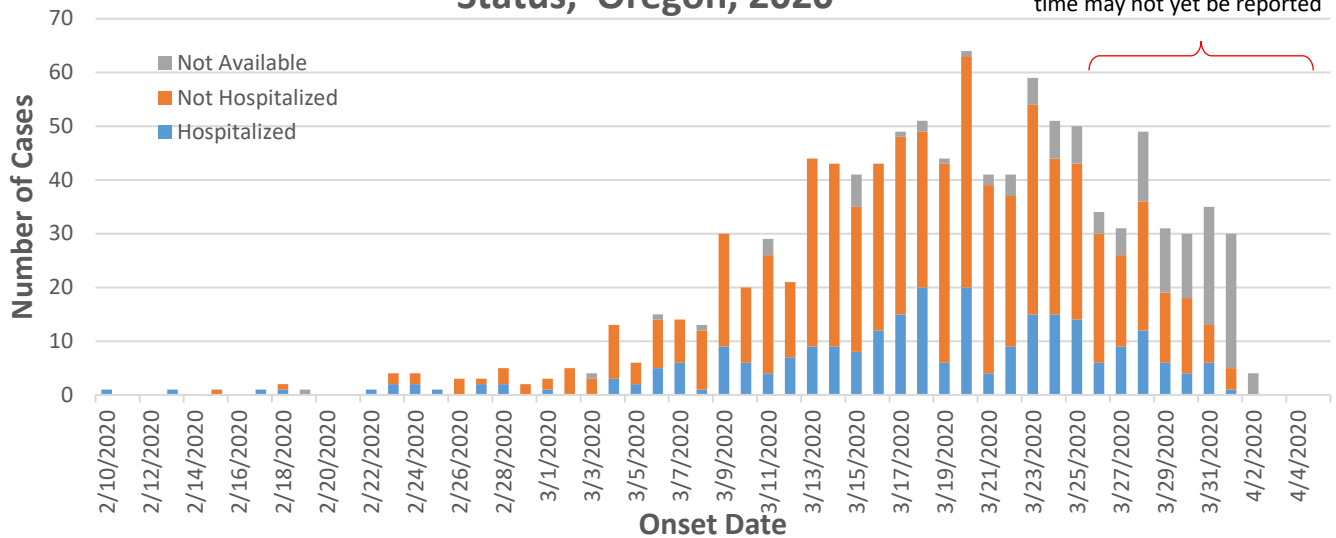
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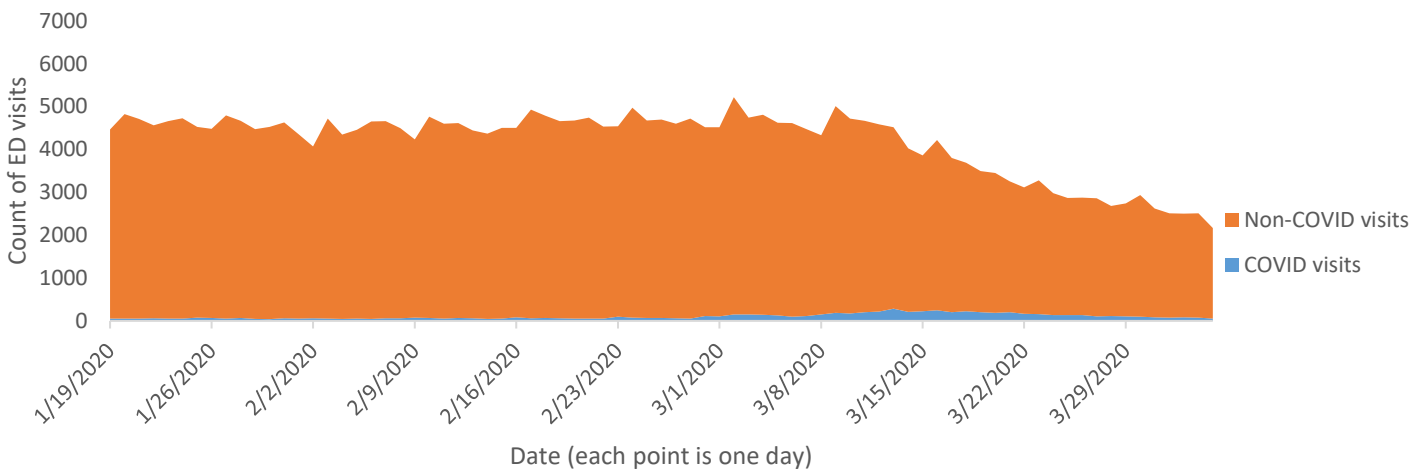


## COVID-19 Cases by Symptom Onset Date and Hospitalization Status, Oregon, 2020

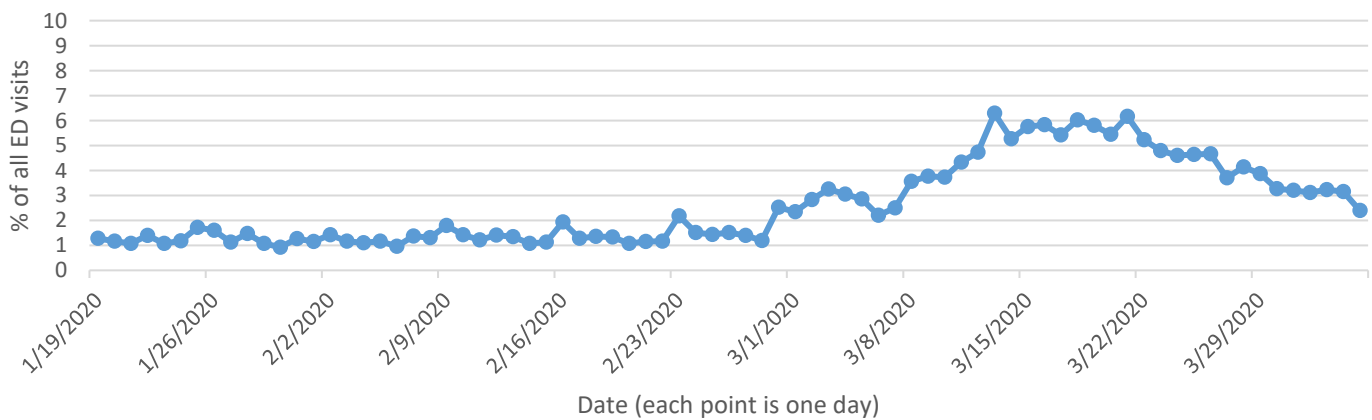

The fuel industry is currently working to address surplus supplies as a result of the travel restrictions and stay-at-home orders in response to COVID 19.</li> <li>• Every year on May 1, the fuel industry transitions from winter grade gasoline to summer grade stocks. On March 27, EPA issued a Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) waiver, allowing companies to continue using the existing surplus supply of winter blend fuels remaining in the system after May 1. Oregon has more stringent requirements. ODOE is working with the Oregon Department of Agriculture and DEQ to ensure all state conditions for an RVP waiver are addressed.</li> </ul>
